Six Fun Ways to Read the Bible

Pathway 1: The Weekly Family Plan (Low Pressure, High Connection)

Gather around the dinner table or on the couch once a week for 15 to 30 minutes. You will read 52 of the Bible's most famous and exciting stories together as a family. Best of all, it includes simple, real-life talking prompts to get everyone sharing their thoughts, making it incredibly easy to talk about faith together.

Pathway 2: The Video-Guided App Plan (Fast-Paced & Visual)

If you love videos, this plan on the free YouVersion Bible App is perfect! Using the 'One Story That Leads to Jesus' track by the BibleProject, your daily readings are paired with awesome, creative animated videos. They sketch out the themes and history of each book before you read, making sure you always understand the big picture.

Pathway 3: The Chronological Plan (The History Adventure)

Think of this as a historical time machine! This plan re-orders the books of the Bible into the actual sequence the events happened in history. Using the free Logos Bible study app, you will experience scripture like a continuous, epic storyline where everything fits together like a giant historical novel.

Pathway 4: The 90-Day Gospels Focus (Up Close with Jesus)

Want a direct look at the life, miracles, and words of Jesus? This focused, daily track walks you through all four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) over exactly 90 days. It is the perfect starting point to build a daily habit while keeping your focus centered directly on Jesus' ministry.

Pathway 5: The Topical Explorer Track (Short & Bite-Sized)

If committing to a long plan feels scary, try starting with shorter, bite-sized plans on the YouVersion app! You can pick quick, thematic plans like 'The Ten Commandments' (12 days), 'The Lord's Prayer' (8 days), or 'The Character of God' (6 days). You get to learn valuable lessons in just a week or two!

Pathway 6: The Genesis-to-Gospel Start (Building Connections)

This self-paced, hands-on path avoids getting bogged down in difficult sections. You start by reading the foundational opening chapters of Genesis to see how the world began, and then jump straight to a Gospel (like Mark or John). This lets you see the immediate connection between the Old Testament promises and Jesus.

What You'll Find:

Think of this as your personal historical time machine! The Logos app lets you read the Bible in the exact order the events actually happened in history, weaving together stories, letters, and songs. It reads like an exciting, continuous story rather than a textbook. Plus, the app is packed with helpful tools to track your reading, take notes, and help you build a solid daily reading habit.

Habit Hacks (No Phone Required!)

The 'Habit Stacking' Hack

Pair your reading with something you already do every single day without fail. For example, tell yourself: 'Right after I pour my morning bowl of cereal,' or 'Right after I brush my teeth at night, I will read my Bible passage.' By pairing it with an existing habit, you'll find it incredibly easy to stay consistent!

The 'Start Smaller' Hack

If committing to read a big chapter every day feels overwhelming, it is completely okay to split a single day's reading across two or three days. Building the simple habit of opening the Bible is much more important than trying to read it quickly!

The 'Bedside Book' Hack (No Phone Needed!)

Don't have a phone? No problem! Keep your physical Bible sitting right on your pillow when you make your bed in the morning. When you go to climb into bed at night, it will be sitting there waiting to greet you and act as a cozy, screen-free bedtime reminder.

The 'Bookmark Habit' Hack (No Phone Needed!)

Fold up your paper Confirmation Bible Reading Form and keep it tucked inside your physical Bible as your bookmark. The second you close the Bible for the day, you can immediately check off your progress right then and there—simple, paper-only, and totally satisfying!

The 'Audio Bus' Hack

If you are on the go, use the free audio narration on Logos or YouVersion to listen to the day's passages on your bus ride to school, in the car, or while waiting for sports practice to start.



Weekly Bible Reading Plan for Your Family

One way to get your family into the Bible is to get a flavor of what the whole Bible is about by reading parts from it each week during the year. That's what this reading plan is all about—to get your family into some of the best-known stories and important lessons from Genesis to Revelation—and to get your family talking about it with simple questions/reflections for every reading. Whether you start this in January or some other time of the year, this plan will help your family read, enjoy, and apply what you read.

Here's how it works:

1. **Commit to spending 15-30 minutes each week** as a family. Maybe it's every Sunday before bed or every Monday at the dinner table. Just pick a time that's going to work for your family and do your best to keep up the routine. And even if you miss a week—**don't give up!** Just pick up where you left off and keep going.
2. **Hang this reading plan somewhere prominent in your house**—making it visible helps everyone to remember!
3. Before reading the Scripture verses each week, **say a prayer** asking God to speak to your family and help you apply his Word to your lives.
4. **Dig in!** Have someone read the passage out loud. Then, have everyone answer the question.
5. **Check off the box** so you can keep track of where you're at.

P.S. Grown-ups! The questions aren't just for the kids—the best way to learn more about each other and grow as a family is when everyone takes a turn sharing.
